Migration and Education: Bridges for a cooperative development.

Dr. Borchardt gave an overview of the history of migration, main reasons for migration and for seeking refuge in other countries, and she introduces some thoughts about the economical and political views on migration, for sending as well as receiving countries. At last, she introduces briefly a good-practice example (with sustainable results) from Marseille, France, that shows how both sides, Europa and Africa, can profit from a cooperation in development activities.
